Over the past few weeks, we have been learning the multiplication and division facts for the 4x and 8x table. We have been exploring the connections between these times tables and learning the different ways we can represent these key facts. Children have used their multiplication and division knowledge to find fractions of amounts e.g what is 1/8 of 24? What is 3/4 of 24? As always please encourage your child to log on to <u>https://ttrockstars.com/</u> where they can play different games. We recommend a little and often approach aiming for about 20 minutes per week.

During this term in our games lessons we have focused on tennis, basketball and hockey. We have learnt how to keep and win possession in a game and how to pass the ball with some level of accuracy and consistency.

We hope you enjoyed the bread rolls the children have made this week as much as they enjoyed making them. We worked hard to measure the ingredients carefully and follow the recipe. There were some very creative designs!

Our recent maths topic has been on fractions, so the children should now be able to multiply and divide them (as well as add or subtract fractions with different denominators). Can we please remind the children to still regularly practise their times tables through Times Table Rockstars. Additional revision free of charge!

In English we have just finished writing persuasively about gadgets for an explorer. We have tried to use higher order conjunctions such as 'although' and 'since' in our sentences. Although the children are not tested on writing during SATs week, we will be continuing to write frequently as pupils final grades are teacher assessed.
