Change the fact once you know it.


In Geography, we will be learning about mountains.

Ask people at home to sing or speak as high and as low as they can! Who has the deepest voice and who has the highest?

Try singing or playing a tune that you know as high and as low as you can. How does it change the mood of the tune? Which do you prefer?


In Art, we will be learning about the photographer Ansel Adams.
