

Key Vocabulary

Human feature	The impact and behaviour of people and how they relate to the physical world.
Physical feature	The Earth's natural features, such as mountains, rivers, deserts and oceans.
Equator	A line drawn on the earth, equal distance from the poles, dividing it into northern and southern hemispheres.
Longitude	Distance measured in degrees east or west of an imaginary line that runs from the north pole to the south pole and passes through Greenwich, England.
Latitude	The distance north or south of the equator measured in degrees.
Biome	A biome is a large community of vegetation and wildlife adapted to a specific climate. The five major types of biomes are aquatic, grassland, forest, desert, and tundra.
Percussion	A percussion instrument is sounded by being struck or scraped by a beater or hand.
Stave	The name given to the five horizontal lines on which we can write music.
