<u>Key Vocabulary</u>	
<b>structure</b>	A building or other object constructed from several parts.
<b>design</b>	A plan or drawing produced to show the look and function or workings of a building, garment, or other object before it is made.
<b>Native Americans</b>	The original people who lived in North and South America for thousands of years before Europeans arrived
<b>continent</b>	Any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica).
<b>physical geography</b>	Physical Geography is the study of the physical features of the Earth, such as oceans, mountains, rivers, coastlines, forests and plant life.
<b>human geography</b>	Features of our world that have been created by people are called human geographical features. Examples of human geographical features include cities, towns, villages, dams, bridges and buildings. Human geography is also concerned with how people move and live.
<b>landscape</b>	The landscape is everything you can see when you look across an area of land, including hills, rivers, buildings, trees, and plants
