# Can your child use a knife and fork?

### Times tables

Learning to quickly recall times tables facts is essential. They form the foundation for quick and accurate calculations in multiplication, division, fractions, and problemsolving across all areas of maths through junior school and beyond. Children are expected to know all multiplication and division facts up to 12x12 by the end of year 4. <a href="https://ttrockstars.com">https://ttrockstars.com</a> is a fantastic way for children to build recall and confidence with their multiplication facts. Research shows that just **21 minutes per week** can make a huge difference! Please encourage your child to use '**Garage Mode'** which is targeted practice and is the quickest way to turn heat maps green. Little and often is the key—help them rock their times tables and boost their maths skills!
