Dear Parents and Carers,

Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE)

As a part of your child's education at Manor Junior School, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme. Using quality resources from 1decision, we incorporate Relationships, Sex and Health education (RSHE) into our PSHE curriculum. Our aim is for all of our pupils to become healthy, safe and responsible members of society, equipped with the knowledge and skills to make the right choices and be the best they can be.

Over the next half term, the children at school will be covering aspects of RSHE (Relationships, Sex and Health Education) as part of their PSHE curriculum. Years 3, 4 and 5 will be covering the statutory elements of Relationships and Health Education and Year 6 will be covering the non-statutory element of Sex Education.

Lessons in Year 3 this term will include pupils learning about appropriate and inappropriate touch, in an age-appropriate context. During this unit, the terms for correct, scientific names for genitalia, such as penis and vagina will be used in some of the sessions. It is vital to ensure that all pupils know this language to ensure the best safeguarding practices. Pupils will also learn about the importance of caring about other people's feelings and understanding personal boundaries.

Lessons in Year 4 this term will include pupils building on their previous learning about appropriate and inappropriate touch in an age-appropriate context, and identifying different types of relationships. They will look at understanding how our families support us and how we can support our families. They discuss how relationships can be healthy and unhealthy and explain how to ask for help and identify who can help them if a relationship makes them feel uncomfortable.

Lessons in Year 5 this term will explore the feelings around growing and changing, including puberty and personal hygiene. Pupils will learn how to develop coping strategies to help with the different stages of puberty as well as identifying the changes in their bodies during this time. Year 5 pupils will watch a short video explaining some of the changes that will happen during puberty. If you visit the link below, you can watch a section of the video that they will watch in class. Lessons in year 6 will include explaining the word conception and reproduction; describing the function of the female and male reproductive systems; identifying the various ways in which adults can have a child; explaining the various stages of pregnancy; and identifying the laws around consent. Pupils will also have opportunities to ask questions across all year groups. All PSHE teaching takes place in a safe learning environment and is underpinned by our school values of ready, respectful, safe and kind. The

curriculum in Years 3 and 4 does not teach about Puberty and Conception so a specific information evening is not necessary. However, if you have any questions or worries, please feel free to email me directly at v.brown@manor-junior.hants.sch.uk and I will reply as soon as I can.
